All word meanings tested are described and illustrated in Words Worth Teaching(Beimiller, 2009). In the same way, we tested another 3,000 root word meanings and rated 2,000 meanings for upper-grade instruction. This time, we looked for mean- ings known by 40-80% of students at the end of grade 6.
